Performance Concerns

- Long legato bowing is key to expressing the flow of the melody from sixteenth notes through dotted half notes.
- Consider the shape and direction of phrases and employ rubato to give the melodic content interest.

Ned Of The Hill (Eamon An Chnuic) is a traditional Irish ballad dating back to the end of the 16th century. Young Ned of the Hill is an outlaw singing to a maiden in a tower. Though he is poor, he asks for her hand in marriage, and they escape together.
